Are you an experienced veterinarian who is passionate about spay/neuter and wants to help feral and rescued cats?

Nine Lives Foundation is a no-kill 501c3 non-profit organization that for 16 years has rescued sick and injured cats and kittens, and played a critical role in saving lives by providing low-cost spay/neuter services for rescuers, trappers, rescue groups, and the community.

We are seeking part-time (as little as 1 day/week, or as much as 5 days/week) spay/neuter veterinarians to work together as a team to optimize the number of animals that we can treat. Our focus is to provide TNR services for community cats/ferals, and spay/neuter for local cat rescue groups enabling them to place friendly cats into forever homes. We also intake at-risk cats, provide medical care, and make them available for adoption.

In addition to the core focus of spay/neuter, as a privately-funded shelter, we have the freedom to devote medical and surgical attention to sick and injured cats that other shelters may not have the resources to help. You would have the discretion to take on a range of treatments and surgeries (e.g., amputations, dental care) that would enable a cat to be released back to the field or placed in a loving home.

ESSENTIAL DUTIES & RESPONSIBILITIES

- Examine animals pre-operatively to determine their ability to withstand surgery
- Perform high-quality, high-volume spay/neuter surgical procedures
- Provide compassionate high-quality preventive and basic medical care to patients
- At your discretion, perform additional life-saving surgeries for feral / community cats, e.g., dental extractions, enucleations and amputations
- Oversee aspects of veterinary care during a clinic day, including physical examination, diagnostics, treatment, recommendations and delivery, prescriptions and discharge information
- Maintain accurate and complete medical records and other records required by local and state laws

EXPERIENCE/QUALIFICATIONS:

- Doctor of Veterinary Medicine (DVM, VMD) or equivalent required
- California State veterinary license required
- 2+ years veterinary experience preferred

- Experience in high-quality, high-volume spay/neuter and feline medical care preferred
- A passion for shelter medicine and cats!
